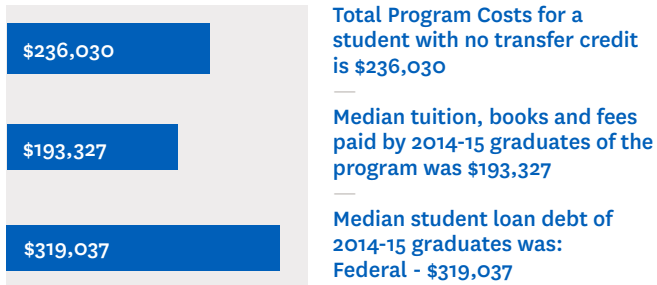
WHAT SERVICES WILL I RECEIVE?

Services available to all students include:

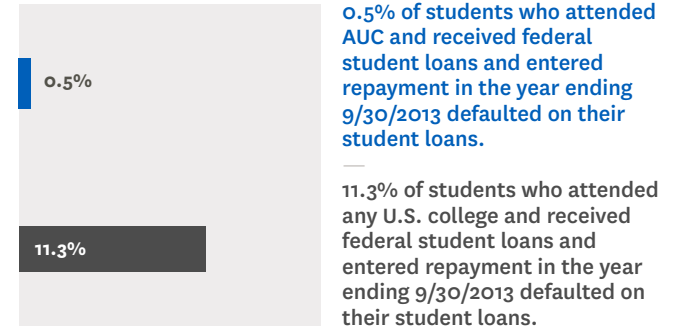
- Student Services provides assistance with enrolling in classes and clerkships as well as financial aid advising.

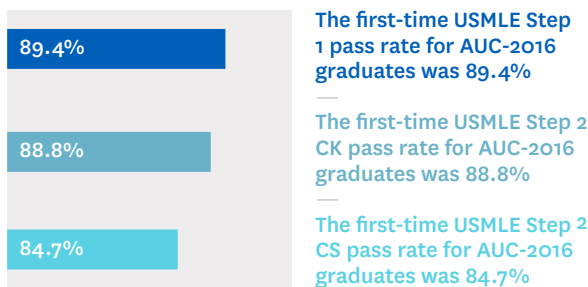
PROGRAM COSTS & STUDENT LOANS



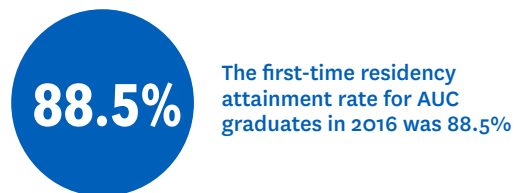
LOAN DEFAULT RATES



LICENSING EXAM PASS RATES

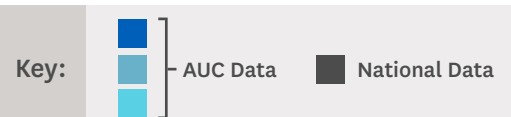


RESIDENCY RATES

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE KNOW BEFORE YOU GO FACT SHEET:

How relevant is this information to me? The Know Before You Go Fact Sheet provides information about AUC and its MD program and information about U.S. colleges as a whole. Certain information, such as earnings outcomes, can be different depending on where you plan to live and your individual situation and experience. The Fact Sheet information is intended to help you compare some information about AUC and its MD program to other colleges as you think about your choices.

INFORMATION SOURCES

Total Program Costs: This is the total tuition, fees and average estimated textbook and equipment expense for a student attending full time who takes and passes every course currently required by the program at AUC a single time at the current tuition rate.

Median tuition, books and fees paid is the median amount paid to AUC by students who graduated from this program in the 2014-15 academic year. This amount is different than the Total Program Costs and may be different for each student because students may transfer credits from other colleges or repeat courses that are not passed the first time.

Median student loan debt is the median of total debt (federal, private and institutional loans) of students who completed this program in the 2014-15 academic year.

Loan Default Rate is the percentage of borrowers (U.S. colleges and American University of the Caribbean Medical School) entering repayment in 2013 who defaulted on their loans within 3 years. USMLE Step Exam Pass Rates are provided by the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG). The rates reflect the percentage of students attempting the exam during the calendar year who passed on the first attempt.

Residency Attainment Rate: AUC's first-time residency attainment rate for 2015-16 graduates in the 2016 match year. Includes residencies obtained outside the main NRMP match.
