



Types of LoRs

Specialty Specific

Written to include your preferred specialty and why you would excel in your chosen field.

You will need at least 1 LoR in your desired specialty to apply to programs in mid-September.



General Letter

Written to show off your skills as a physician, but does not specify your desired specialty. They are intended to be supplementary to help support your specialty-specific LoR.

Clerkship/Externship

You will likely be securing LoRs from AUC Clerkships. Clerkships and Externships can have the biggest impact on your application with clerkships ranking the highest.



Observership

Observerships can be helpful if you are hoping to familiarize yourself with a private practice or hospital setting as well as to enhance your CV.

Academic

Academic LoRs are from hospitals associated with a teaching program. These letters generally carry more weight and should make up the majority of the LoRs in your application.



Private Practice

Private Practice LoRs can still be helpful to your application; however, Academic LoRs should comprise the majority of the LoRs in your application.

US, Canadian & UK Letters



Standard Letter of Evaluation (SLoE)

Required if applying to Emergency Medicine

Students will need at least two SLoEs during the application season

1 SLoE prior to NRMP Registration in mid-September for interview consideration

1 SLoE prior to Rank Order List Deadline in late February for ranking consideration



Who to Ask for a LoR


Physicians who have witnessed you in a clinical setting

Physicians who are familiar with your clinical abilities, medical knowledge and work ethic

Physicians who are aware of your interpersonal skills with patients and your ability to work in a team



How to Ask for a LoR





Which Rotations Should I Request LoRs From?

Preferred Specialty:
Core & Elective

Specialty that Interests You

(This will give you more options when selecting a specialty to apply to for residency)

A Complementary Specialty

(ex: Pediatrics if you are applying to Family Medicine because you will likely work with children as well in this specialty) **Note:** Texas and California both require at least 4 weeks of an ACGME-sponsored rotation in Family Medicine in order to be eligible for licensure.



To Waive or Not to Waive Right



AUC's recommendation is for students to waive their right to view the letter.

If the LoR is viewed before it is submitted, it can be perceived as not as genuine compared to someone who waived his or her right to view it.



Process for Uploading the LoR

Letter of Recommendation Portal (LoRP) will need your AAMC #

Must be PDF, no more than 500KB, no electronic signature and must be on official letterhead


Cannot be uploaded by medical school or member of hospital staff in an advising role

A minimum of 3 letters per application and maximum of 4

Mac users should use Firefox or Chrome as ERAS does <u>not</u> support Safari



Submitting LoRs Early





LoR Deadline

September 7th

Of the year prior to the Match

ECFMG recommends submitting your supporting documents by this date in order to guarantee their availability to programs by September 15th.

* Check the ECFMG Timeline as dates are subject to change

Note: Your MSPE letter will be uploaded by the OSPD and will not be released to programs until October 1st.
