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


WELCOME

Tung Yuen Supermarket (Asian Market)

- 1-minute walk away from AUC Welcome Center
- This is a corner store market with a lot more than you'd expect. Anything from dry to wet goods. Eggs, milk, juices, spices, dry food, canned food, bread, sauces/spreads, and a few microwavable items. If you don't feel like cooking or forgot an item from one of the larger grocery stores, a stop to the Asian market is perfect. It also has a few household items.

Carrefour (Jordan VIllage location)

- New location, 3-minute walk from campus.
- This is a small supermarket with a lot of American food and products. You can buy most of the necessary cooking items here. Fresh produce, fruits, meats, fish, snacks, breads, cheeses, etc. They give a 5% discount to AUC students.

Prime

- 15 minute drive from campus
- This is the most similar store to Sam's Club/Costco, though probably half the size. Everything here is sold in bulk so this is a very good location to buy cereal, canned goods, snacks, and anything else you would buy from a wholesale store.





SHOPPING TIP

As you settle into Sint Maarten, we hope you do your part to preserve and conserve the beauty and safety of the island. Please consider bringing or purchasing reusable bags that can hold your groceries and home goods!

Carrefour (Porto Cupecoy or Colebay locations)

• 10-minute walk from campus or a 2-minute drive via AUC shuttle or Carrefour shuttle

Carrefour (Phillipsburg location)

- 25-minute drive from campus
- This is the largest Carrefour on the island and is brand new. With a large stock and wide variety, you can find almost everything you need here, including spices, American brand goods, frozen food products, and household items. Students recommend buying meat and produce here. They also give a 5% discount to AUC students.

Super-U (Marigot)

- 30-35 minute drive to the French side of the island
- This is another very large supermarket where you can find most of the groceries that you need. Be aware that everything written on products is in French but item locations and pictures make it navigable. This store is cost-friendly option that also provides a 5% AUC student discount.

AUC Bookstore

The campus Bookstore offers a variety of school supplies, medical instruments, and university apparel for purchase. We encourage you to stop by and browse our inventory.

CAMPUS SECURITY

AUC is committed to providing a secure and crime-free campus environment. Security awareness is an important part of our culture at AUC we and encourage all students, faculty, and staff to accept responsibility for their own safety as well as the safety of others. The AUC Office of Safety and Security renders a 24/7 service and maintains ongoing communication with the police department of Sint Maarten. We closely monitor the campus as well as nearby residencies and neighborhoods using surveillance monitoring, bike patrols, k-9 service, and a shuttle service. They are also responsible for emergency response, campus vehicle registration, university ID badges, lost and found, and wellness checks. Please refer to the annual safety and student disclosures brochure for updated campus crime statistics as well as information on reporting procedures, appropriate conduct, the disaster/emergency response plan, etc.



Campus Access & ID Badges

The AUC campus and University Apartments are monitored by security personnel. The only people allowed on campus are AUC faculty, staff, students, spouses and authorized visitors who have current ID badges. AUC reserves the right to ask any visitor, student or staff member to leave the facility following any disruptive behavior. Visitors must check in with security and obtain a guest permit. This will enable them to access the campus if the visit is authorized.

Safety and security personnel will issue students an identification badge during registration.

Complimentary Shuttle Service

During evening hours, AUC offers a courtesy shuttle service from campus to surrounding neighborhoods (Maho, Beacon Hill, Point Pirouette, and Cupecoy). 

MEET THE CAMPUS LEADERSHIP TEAM



Pedro L. Delgado, MD

Senior Associate Dean, Sint Maarten Campus

Pedro L. Delgado, MD, is the Senior Associate Dean of AUC's Sint Maarten campus, where he is responsible for faculty affairs and government and community relations. As Senior Associate Dean, Dr. Delgado contributes to the culture of AUC's medical sciences campus and leads efforts to foster community engagement and academic excellence.

Dr. Delgado joined AUC in April 2019 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS) where he served as the Marie Wilson Howells Professor and Chair of the Department of Psychiatry in the College of Medicine and Director of the UAMS Psychiatric Research Institute (PRI) from 2014 – 2018.

Dr. Delgado earned a BS in biology summa cum laude from the University of Houston and his MD (AOA) and MA (Pharmacology) from the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston, Texas. After completing his internship and residency training in psychiatry at Yale University School of Medicine, Dr. Delgado served on their faculty from 1987 – 1992 and led research programs investigating the neurobiological basis of depression and the mechanisms of antidepressant drug action. He subsequently served on the faculty of the University of Arizona College of Medicine, Case Western Reserve School of Medicine, and the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. Over the past 20 years, Dr. Delgado has served in a variety of leadership positions, including Vice Chair for Research in Arizona, Douglas Danford Bond Professor and Chairman of Psychiatry at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine (2000-2005), and Dielmann Distinguished Chair and Chairman of Psychiatry at the UT Health Science Center in San Antonio (2005-2014).

Dr. Delgado's academic interests include multidisciplinary, team-based approaches to health care; mentoring of medical students, postdoctoral fellows and faculty; clinical research training; compensation and evaluation procedures in academic medical centers; and faculty wellness, development and professionalism. He is most known for his groundbreaking work using neurotransmitter depletion to study antidepressant mechanisms. For his work investigating the biology of depression, he shared the international Anna Monika Prize in 1995.

Dr. Delgado has published over 100 scientific articles and book chapters concerning these and related topics, is a member of many organizations and societies, serves on the editorial boards of prominent psychiatric journals, is a grant reviewer for the National Institutes of Health, and is a frequent lecturer on biological aspects of depression and clinical use of antidepressant drugs.



Colin Michie, FRCPCH

Dr. Colin Michie joined AUC's campus in St. Maarten in September of 2017 as Associate Dean of Academic Affairs. Dr. Michie oversees students' learning outcomes and works with the Senior Associate Dean of Academic and Student Affairs to develop programs and initiatives that enhance students' academic experiences both inside and outside of the classroom. His office advises students on academic practices and scheduling, and supports the direction of AUC's orientation and dean's list programs.

Dr. Michie has an extensive career in clinical and academic work. As a senior pediatrician in the United Kingdom (UK) and the former Pediatric Clerkship Director at Ealing Hospital, he developed interdisciplinary bedside training opportunities for junior doctors, midwives, and medical and nursing students at several leading UK teaching hospitals.

Dr. Michie earned his BM, BCh from the University of Oxford, his MA from the University of Cambridge, and his FRCPCH from the Royal College of Pediatrics and Child Health.

Dr. Scott Rinker is Campus Dean of Student Affairs, providing leadership over resources for students from first foot on campus until transition into clinicals. He is responsible for numerous campus and student experience programs and committees, including MSAS (medical sciences academic support board), recreational sports, student government, student judicial council, student conduct and professionalism, CARE, new student orientation, White Coat ceremony, and various student clubs and organizations.

Prior to working at AUC, Dr. Rinker worked at Houston Community College, a comprehensive community college that serves over 70,000 students across 23 campuses with a service area of 631.3 square miles. He worked as the system-wide student affairs officer, leading and managing disability support services, student conduct reporting and compliance, Title IX processes, and international student advising.

Dr. Rinker is interested in the academic and personal success of students at AUC as well as promoting organizational change that makes those aspirations a reality. He is the father of two beautiful children and husband to a lovely mother, researcher, and public health educator. He holds a BS from Texas A&M University, an MA from the University of Houston – Clear Lake, and a PhD from Texas A&M University.

Dr. Golden Jackson is Assistant Dean for Community Engagement at the American University of the Caribbean School of Medicine. In that role, she works with St. Maarten government, community groups, students and faculty to support design and implementation of projects that contribute to community priorities and to student learning. She provides leadership for two all-AUC events each semester, Community Action Day and Project H.E.L.P. Community Action Day is a day set aside for AUC students, faculty, staff, and family to engage with community partners in projects related to health and well-being, education, and child development. Project H.E.L.P. (Health, Education, Literacy, Prevention) is a health screening and educational program offered in community settings throughout St. Maarten.

Before joining AUC in 2012, she held faculty and administrative appointments at The Ohio State University. She taught courses in housing policy, ecological effects of consumption patterns, women's workplace issues, and community development and directed the Service-Learning Initiative, providing support for development of service-learning courses in the 17 colleges of the university.

Dr. Jackson earned degrees from Mississippi University for Women (BS), University of North Carolina at Greensboro (MS), and The Ohio State University (PhD).




