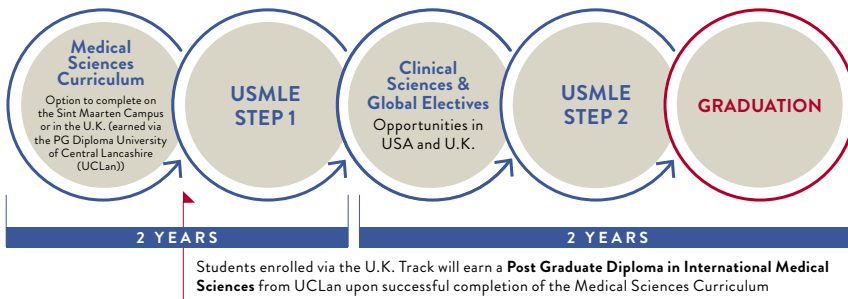




AUC SCHOOL OF MEDICINE FACT SHEET

YEARS 1 & 2

MEDICAL SCIENCES: SEMESTERS 1-5 Sint Maarten or the United Kingdom*

Students begin their journey to become physicians on AUC's state-of-the-art medical sciences campus in Sint Maarten or via our U.K. Track program site at the University of Central Lancashire in Preston, England, where they complete coursework aimed at helping them master medical knowledge while learning to integrate it with clinical practice. Students' clinical skills training begins in semester one and builds in each subsequent semester using case-based learning, standardized patients and high-fidelity simulation. Students learn through a variety of teaching formats including lecture, small-group sessions and laboratory activities.

* The U.K. track option is only available to eligible Non-U.S. Citizens.

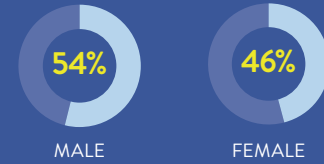
YEARS 3 & 4

CLINICAL SCIENCES: SEMESTERS 6-9.5 United States and United Kingdom

During the clinical portion of the MD program, students perform as an active member of a team comprised of students, residents and attending physicians. Under supervision, clinical students perform histories and physicals, evaluate laboratory data, analyze information to diagnose patient cases and undertake limited procedures. Clerkships are completed in clinical settings in the United States and United Kingdom, and student assessment is geared to preparing students to master the 13 entrustable professional activities that all medical students should be able to perform on the first day of residency training.

INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNIZED & ACCREDITED PROGRAM

AUC School of Medicine is accredited by the Accreditation Commission on Colleges of Medicine (ACCM, www.accredmed.org).

AUC School of Medicine is recognized by the U.K.'s General Medical Council (GMC).+ AUC School of Medicine graduates are automatically eligible to apply to take the PLAB (Professional and Assessment Board) test and apply for GMC registration without requiring an individual assessment. This automatic institutional recognition gives AUC graduates a clear path to pursue a residency position in the U.K. and makes them eligible to apply for U.K. licensure.

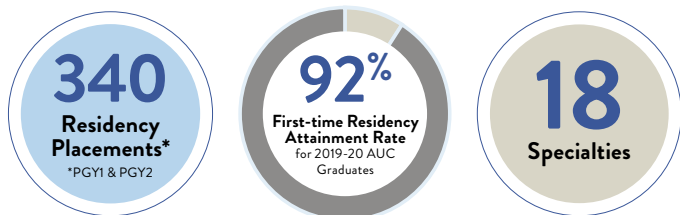
+ Effective for students who started in September 1, 2019 or later. Students who started AUC prior to September 1, 2019 can apply to take the PLAB test and apply for GMC registration once the GMC has completed an individual assessment.

STUDENT LIFE

AUC has over 25 student organizations on our Sint Maarten campus that enable students to connect socially and professionally around topics such as medical specialties, shared cultural backgrounds and other topics that connect students' academic learning with their personal interests.

PREPARING PRACTICE READY PHYSICIANS

Preparing our students to attain a medical school residency placement is one of AUC's highest priorities. In 2020, graduates secured 340 residency positions, and our 2019–20 graduating class achieved a 92% first-time eligible residency attainment rate. Our graduates earned residencies in 18 specialties and entered residency programs in 37 U.S. states and Canada.

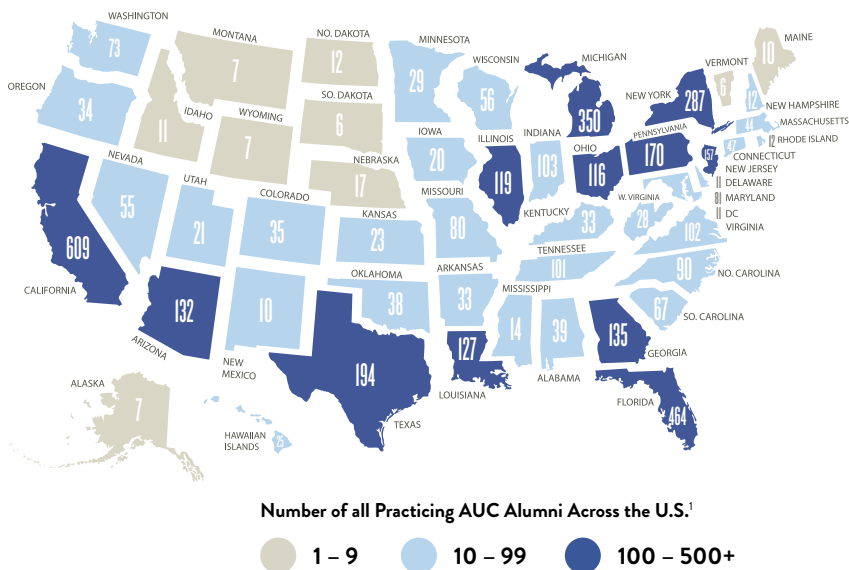


AUC continues to contribute a significant number of primary care physicians to the U.S. healthcare workforce. This year, 71% of total positions earned by AUC graduates were in Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Pediatrics and obstetrics and gynecology—the heart of primary care.

CLINICAL ROTATIONS & GLOBAL HEALTH EXPERIENCES

AUC Students have the option to complete Clinical Rotations in the U.S. or U.K. via our 23 affiliated teaching hospitals. Our students also have the opportunity to gain valuable clinical experiences by completing rotations in five international locations in addition to the U.K., including the Dominican Republic, Russia, Uganda, Vietnam and Zimbabwe. These experiences provide our students with exposure to different healthcare settings and systems, allow them to interact with diverse patient populations, and challenge them to develop the resourcefulness and reasoning skills necessary to become quality physicians.
